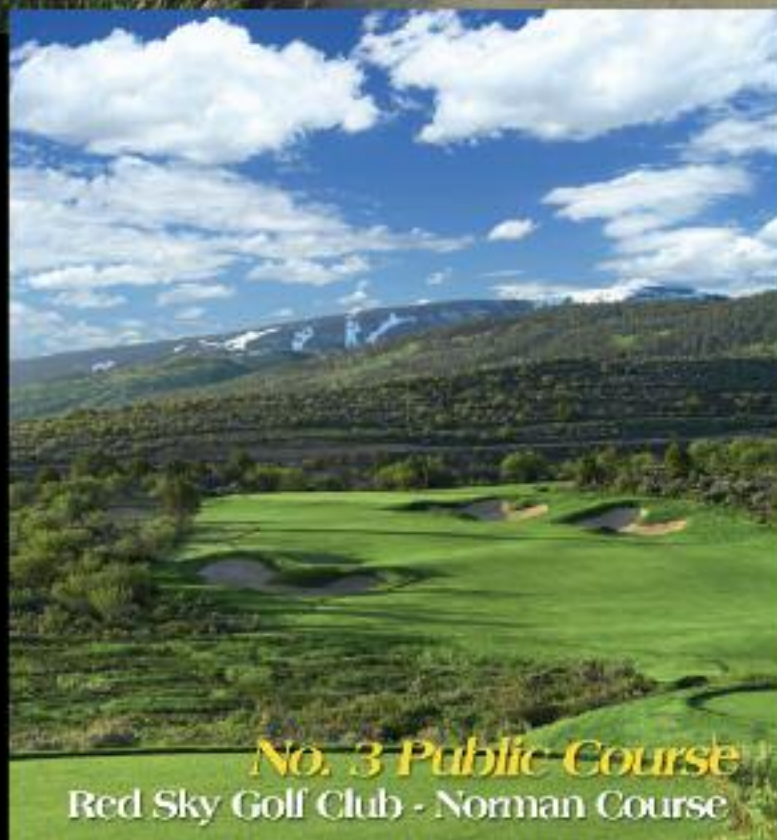

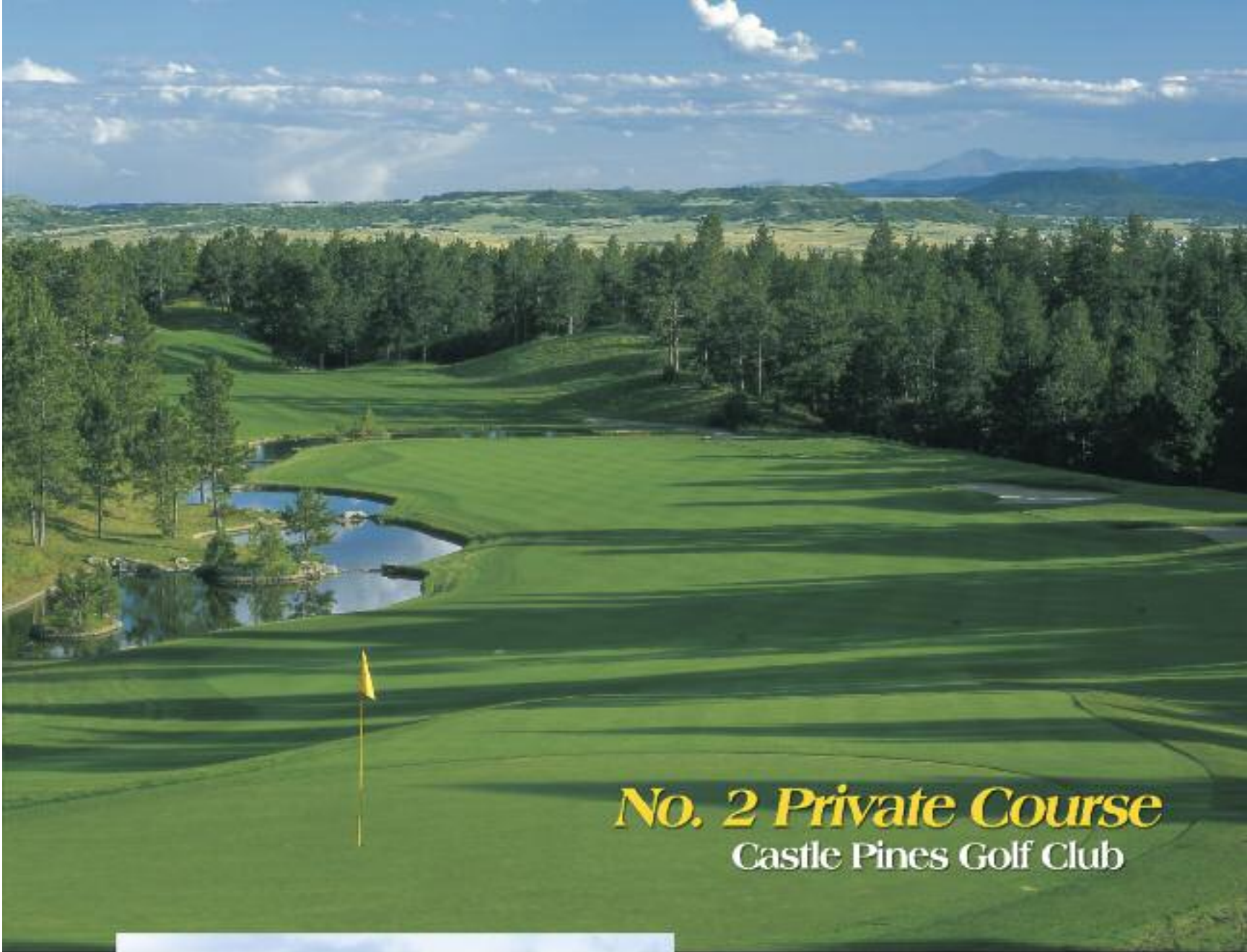
### Sammy's "Rocktail" Scene

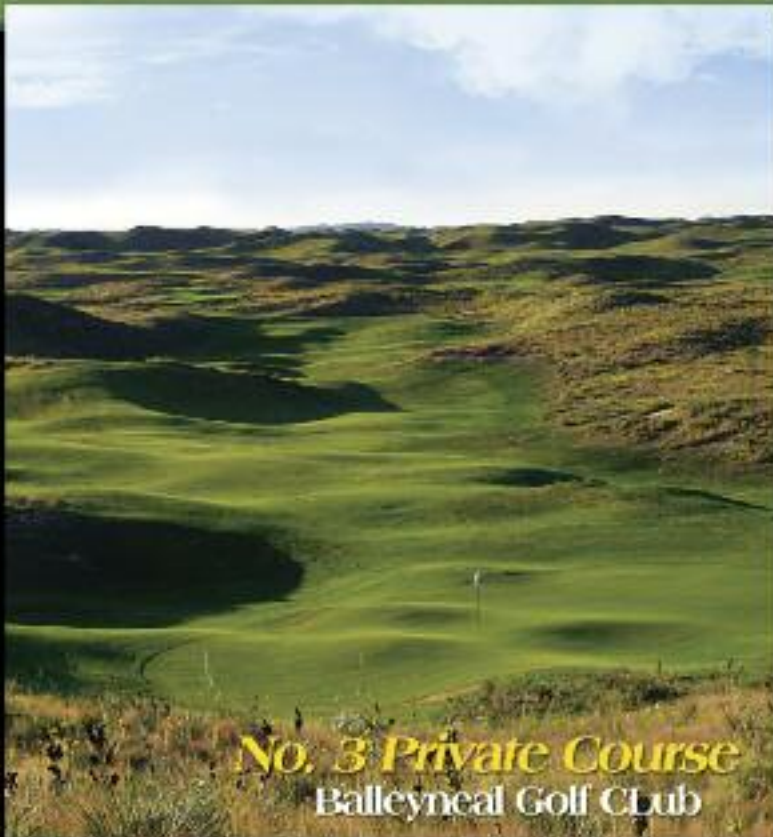

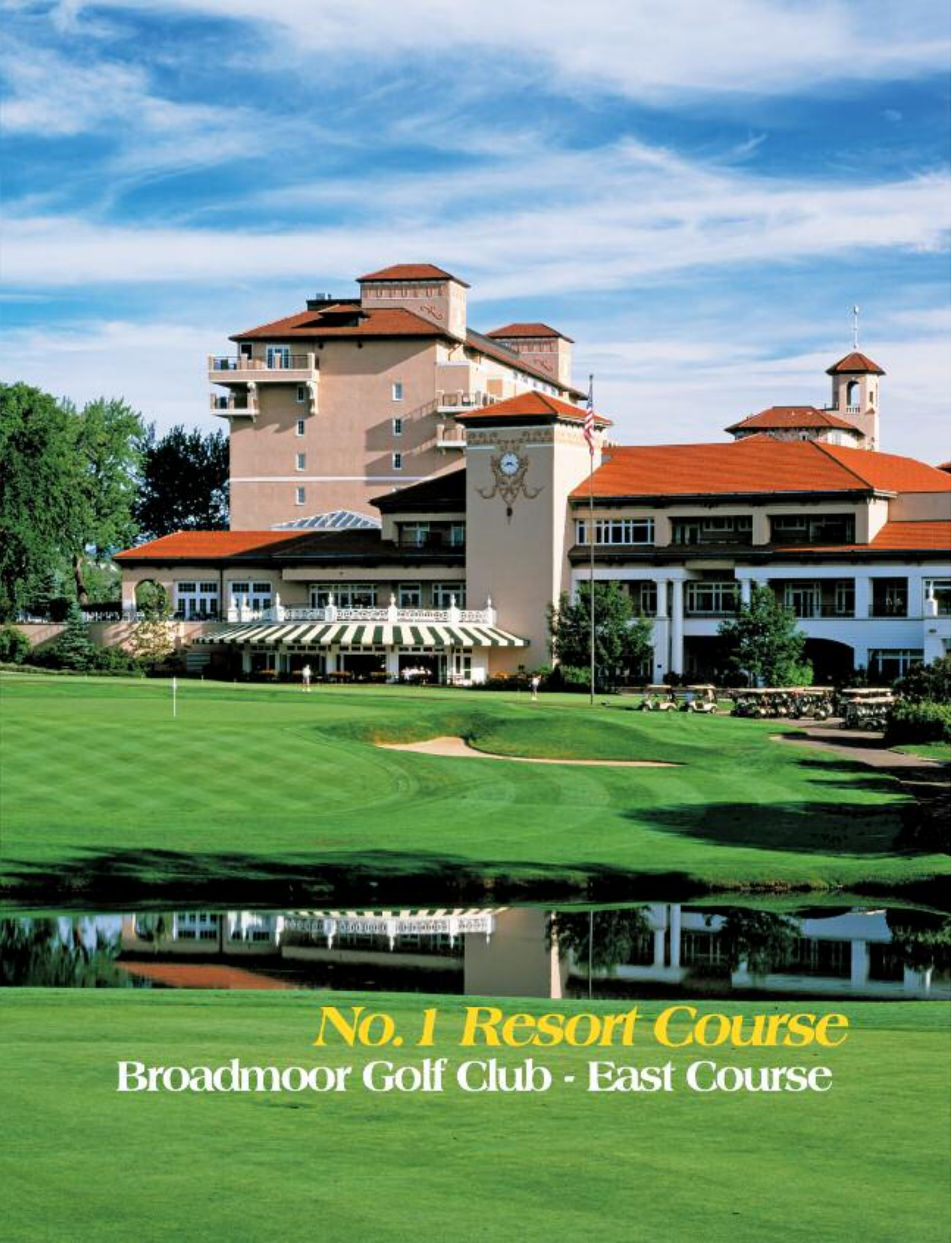


***No. 2 Private Course***

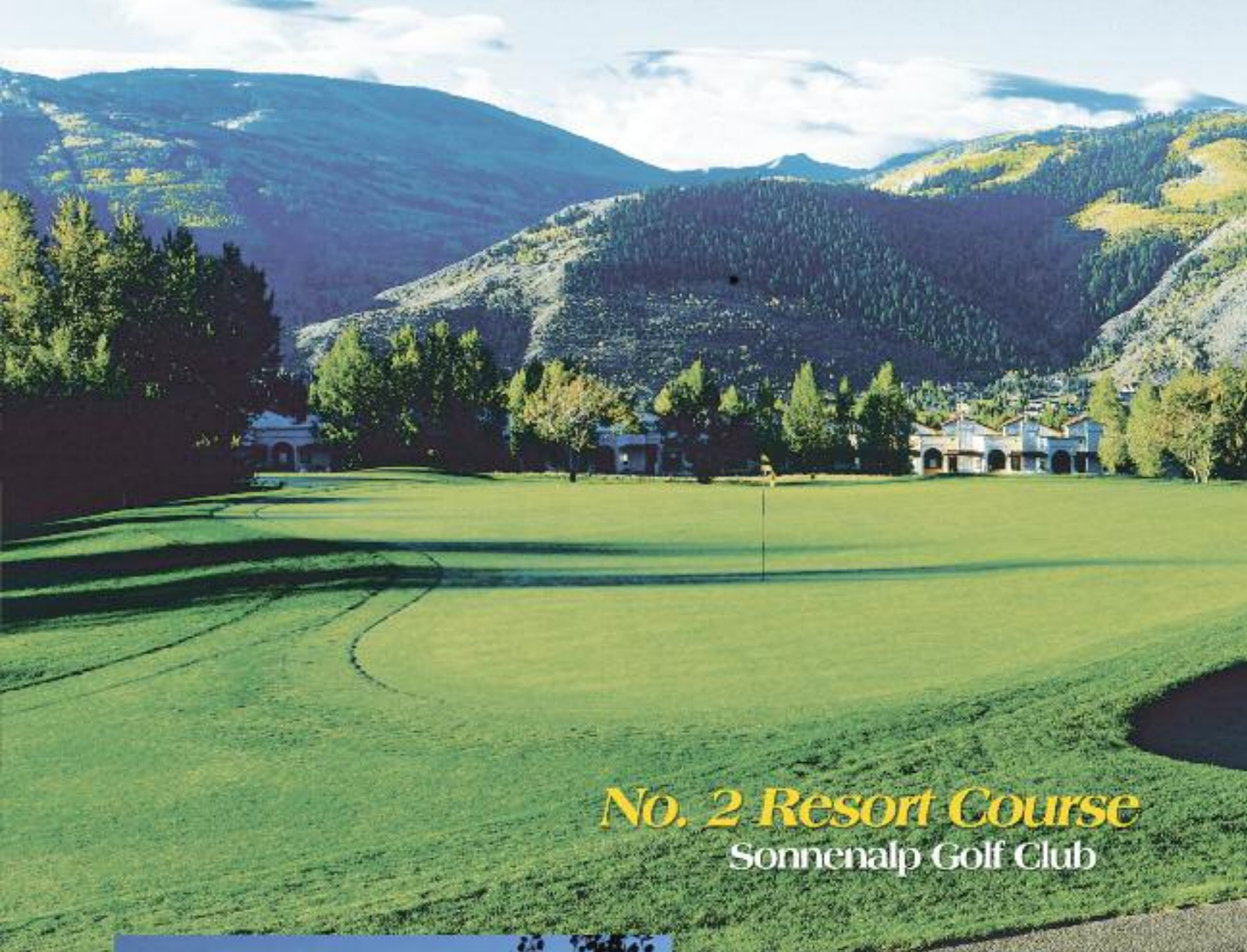

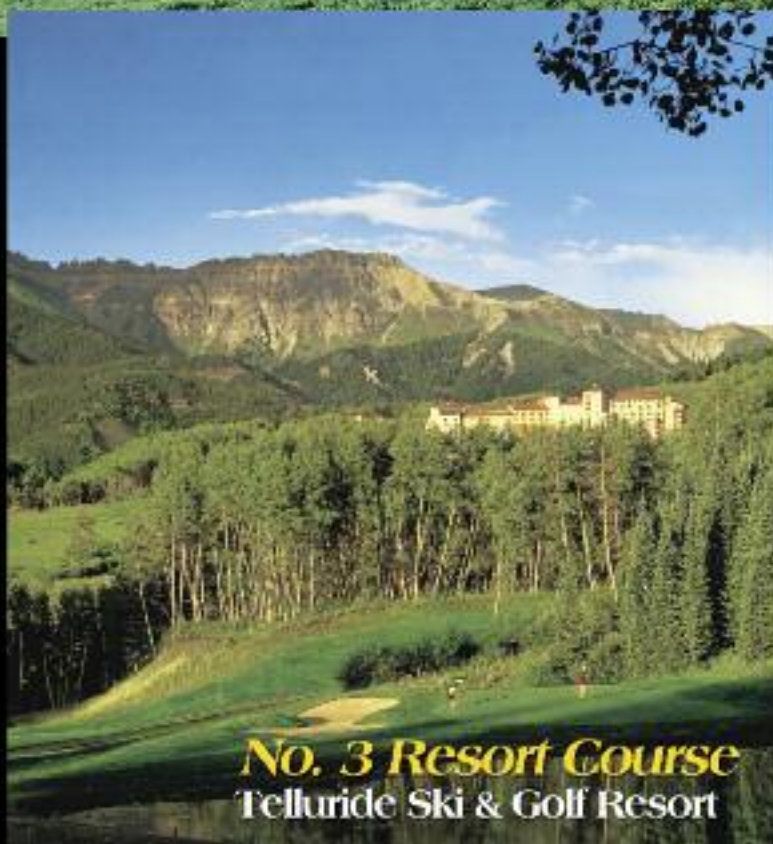

# Denver Golf Expo

Deals, seminars, junior-golf putting and giveaways highlight annual three-day experience

**M**ore experience than exhibition, the 2012 Denver Golf Expo is always held near Valentine's Day—a three-day demonstration of Colorado's love affair with the game. Sure, there are expected deals on equipment and rounds of golf, but attendees also can test clubs at the indoor driving range or take in a seminar, and kids can try their hand at the putting course in the junior golf area. The event has garnered some national acclaim as a golf-expo model, and show managers Mark and Lynn Cramer are determined to give area golfers everything they could possibly wish for in an indoor venue during the off season. "From the get-go, Lynn and I decided the show has to be a reflection of what the golf industry is in Colorado," says Mark. This year's show runs from Feb. 10-12 at the Denver Merchandise Mart.

Why do most people attend? "They want to hit new-model clubs and buy golf merchandise," says Cramer, who has continually solicited feedback on the event since acquiring the show in 2001. "We give people a chance to get a new club in their hands to take them to new heights, get them excited about golf and get them out on the course sooner. Lennie's Golf has done an outrageous job getting all the manufacturers here and sponsoring an indoor driving range with 15 mats."

Traditionally, the expo has offered onsite drawings and giveaways to attendees, and this year is no exception. Golfers receive a certificate for a lob wedge, as well as a one-year subscription to *Golf Digest*. South Suburban's "Fore Golf" incentives give enthusiasts a variety of complimentary offers during specific dates throughout the season: a free round of golf, a cart and range balls with the purchase of greens fees, as well as additional two-for-one rounds and supplementary range balls. The special offers are valid at Lone Tree, South Suburban, Family Sports and

Littleton courses. Expo attendees can also register to win a five-night, six-day Las Vegas golf getaway, including four rounds of golf for two people at Siena, Arroyo, Angel Park and The Legacy courses, with five nights lodging at the Suncoast Hotel & Casino.

For years, Cramer has worked extensively with the Colorado Section PGA and the Colorado Golf Association to improve the show and offer perks to help attract new golfers; both groups hold business meetings at the expo. This year, attendees can look for Golf 2.0 seminars, part of a new PGA initiative to grow player participation nationwide. Cramer says junior golfers can try out the new onsite putting course, an effort to take kids out of the Wii mindset and get a real golf club in their hands. All golfers can take advantage of this year's used-club sale—sellers receive a percentage of their sales, or can donate their clubs outright with all profits going to junior-golf programs across the state.

Nearly 11,000 golf fans attended last year's expo, and Cramer says parking space was at a premium. This year, in addition to the Mart lots, parking will be available on the east side of Washington Street, where shuttles will take attendees directly to the show entrance. Cramer says the busiest times generally are at each day's opening, but lines can be avoided by buying tickets ahead of time at Tickets West outlets or any King Soopers store. Show hours are Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission prices are \$12 for adults, \$10 for ages 50 and over as well as active military and veterans. Kids under 12 are admitted free. For details about this year's show, visit [denvergolfexpo.com](http://denvergolfexpo.com).

# The Gallery

## *Survives Tough Times*

A supportive owner and responsive management  
keep this club maintained and membership strong

**G**iant saguaros, some reaching 50 feet in height, stand like sentinels on the desert hillsides, and with a life span of up to 200 years—survivors all. They frame the photogenic green fairways of The Gallery Golf Club, one of the few private clubs prospering in this difficult economic climate.

Located in Marana, Ariz., 25 minutes north of Tucson, The Gallery opened in 1998 within the master-planned golf community of Dove Mountain. The privately owned, non-equity club features two highly acclaimed golf courses—North and South—and a stunning clubhouse designed by noted architect Bing Hu. The tranquil setting at 3,000 feet of elevation affords 50-mile mountain vistas and cool breezes.

It's fair to say that many private clubs across the nation have suffered with the economy. Fairways are turning brown, maintenance is being neglected and memberships are up for sale in record numbers. Some clubs impose assessments on members or open the course to public play to bring in badly needed revenue.

Fortunately, that's not the case at The Gallery. The club and the golf courses continue to be well maintained, and capital improvements have taken place as scheduled. The quality golf experience has actually been enhanced. Greens were rebuilt on the North Course in 2008 and bunkers renovated in 2009.

Xeriscaping was introduced in some areas as part of the new turf-reduction program to conserve water. A Sports Club was opened in 2005 with a fitness center, outdoor pool and tennis courts.

The North Course, designed by John Fought and Tom Lehman, was named Arizona's Best New Private Course when it opened in 1998. It plays up through the foothills of the Tortolita Mountains, into sheltered box canyons of exquisite beauty. An original cattle loading chute remains alongside No. 5 fairway, a striking reminder that this land was a working ranch back in the 1920s. Rancher "Cush" Cayton's home sits atop a high hill, abandoned now, and accessible only by a treacherous switchback trail.

North Course No. 9 is one of the longest golf holes in the world at 725 yards. John Daly is the only person ever to hit the green in two. Supposedly he used a driver and 3-wood, but some say driver and 1-iron. Either way, it was a phenomenal feat.

John Fought designed the South Course, which opened in 2003 to rave reviews. It was the host site for the World Golf

Championships-Accenture Match Play Championship in 2007 and 2008. Gallery General Manager Phil Satterfield says, "It put Marana on the map and was good for all of us on Dove Mountain." In 2009 the Match Play moved to the new Ritz Carlton Golf Club, Dove Mountain.

Members of The Gallery are eager to talk about their club. Robin Lane, an avid golfer who plays to a 5.6 handicap index, joined in 2003. Lane says, "We like that The Gallery has two totally different courses, the club allows walking and it's a great community in which to live. The club is strong and well maintained, and members are not burdened with assessments."

Members attribute their club's stability to owner John MacMillan's consistent support and pride of ownership.

The name is derived from an eclectic collection of gallery-quality artwork on display throughout the clubhouse. The Gallery is more of a golf club than a traditional country club. It began with the owner's vision for the club, which Satterfield describes as "immaculate golf, good meals and good people."

Paul Nolen, head golf professional since the opening, makes sure the club delivers the "purist golf" experience members demand. About 40% of members prefer to walk and The Gallery makes that easy. Walking paths were expanded to six feet

wide for PGA Tour players at the Match Play and they have been regularly maintained ever since. Each course offers eight sets of tees, all of which are rated, including the popular "combo tees."

Members appreciate that management is so responsive. Robin Lane declares that the women's golf group is thrilled with the new forward tee on No. 18 South. They lobbied hard to move the tee box to the opposite side of the fairway, in order to avoid a dangerous blind tee shot.

Luxury homes are clustered in small neighborhoods tucked away among the rugged canyons of Dove Mountain,

including along the Gallery golf courses. Wide fairway setbacks are part of the original course design, so the homes rarely intrude. Even the cart paths are unobtrusive, running alongside instead of crisscrossing fairways. The Gallery golf experience leaves nothing to chance.

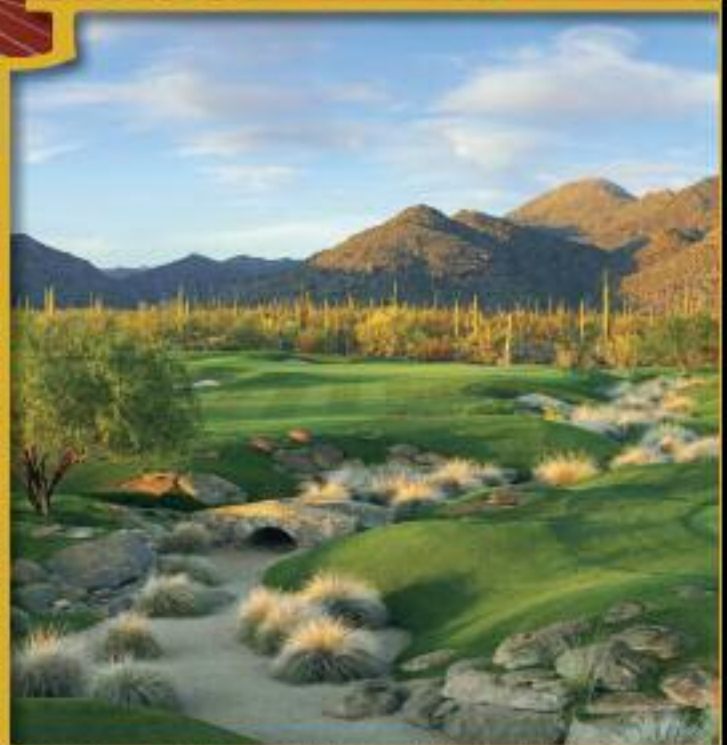

# Play Better In Season

FitKit co-creator Amie Hoff shares workout and nutrition guidelines to help shave strokes



**W**hether your golf clubs are firmly planted in storage till next season or within easy reach for unexpected warm weather, staying fit during the off-season may help lower your score next time you tee it up.

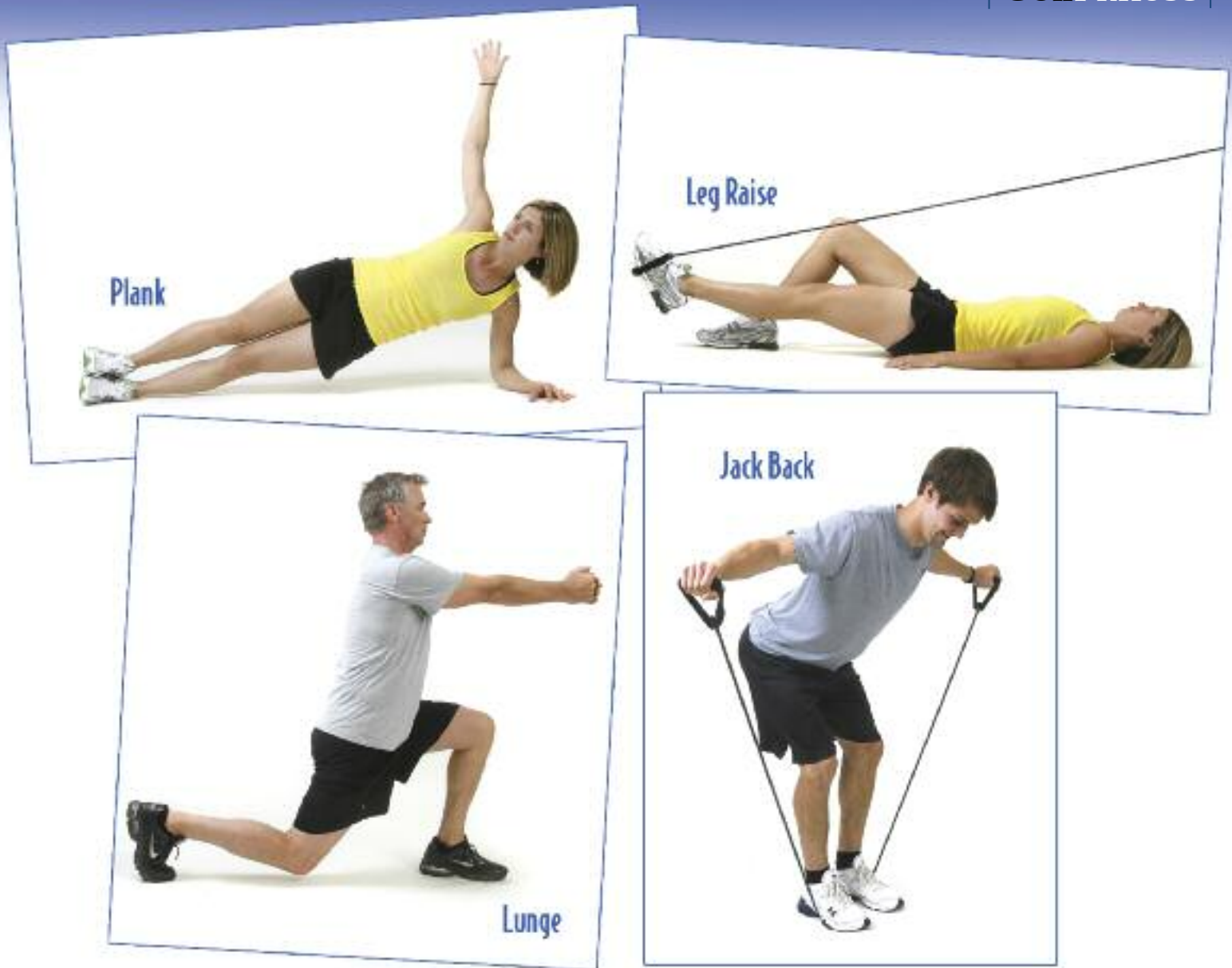
Amie Hoff, certified personal trainer and co-creator of a portable workout system called FitKit, says that enhancing your physical fitness year-round can improve your game. "This is a perfect opportunity to use the off-season to make improvements," she says. "Time off the course is great to increase flexibility and develop strength to improve your swing."

According to Hoff, 75 percent of golf injuries occur on the driving range, so she recommends spending at least 15 minutes stretching before practicing and playing. "Increasing flexibility in the low back, core, shoulders and hamstrings not only will make the golf game better and more enjoyable, but everyday aches and pains may be alleviated," she says. "If golfers put a little more time

and intention into stretching major golfing muscles, their game will improve dramatically."

Maintaining a healthy weight can also reduce the possibility of injury. Hoff recommends six small meals a day and a diet consisting of 50 to 60 percent carbohydrates, 20 to 30 percent protein and 20 to 25 percent fat. "Healthy snacks might include a piece of fruit, an energy bar or nuts to keep blood-sugar levels constant," she says. "On the course, drink 12 ounces of water every hour, or every four holes. Serious golfers should avoid caffeine and alcohol, which are diuretics and can cause fluid loss and dehydration leading to decreased performance."

Hoff's portable workout kits feature a golf-specific version that includes a resistance tube with cushioned handles and door attachment, a flat resistance band, a jump rope and a pedometer. "FitKitGOLF has all the tools for snowbound golfers to work out at home to prime the body for next year," she says. "Our online library has over 250 exercises and stretches specific to golfers' needs, so



you will be ready next spring to go out swinging with lower scores and longer drives."

Golf-specific exercises in the FitKit library address not only flexibility but eye-hand coordination and upper-body moves for swing action and club control. There's also concentration on core strength for lower- to upper-body force transfer, and lower-body moves for power production and stability.

Overall, Hoff's go-to exercise for golfers is the trunk-rotation anchor: With the door attachment at shoulder height, stand parallel to the door, facing away and holding onto one or both handles of the resistance tube (depending on difficulty), arms out. "Using your obliques and a slight bend in the elbows, twist the upper body 180 degrees. Try to keep hips straight forward." FitKit exercises accommodate fitness buffs, as well as first-timers.

"I've always lifted some weight in the gym, and wouldn't have believed these bands could be as effective as free weights or machines, but they've made a huge difference in my golf game," writes a golfer from Tucson, Ariz. "My lower back and core are much stronger, and my overall strength has improved. Most importantly, I am driving the ball farther than I have in 20 years."

Hoff, a New York-based certified physical trainer who has worked with such celebrities as singer P.Diddy and TV physician Dr. Oz, co-created the FitKit system a year ago with her sister, Beth

Michaels, a triathlete, cyclist and golfer. "All of the nutrition and fitness tips came from both my experiences and Beth's, as a fitness professional and a golfer," says Hoff. The duo also asked golfers to share tips they felt would be beneficial to others.

The company works with corporate wellness programs and has a philanthropic mindset as well, donating 25 percent of October sales to Bosom Buddies for breast-cancer research. Hoff says she is happy to work with nonprofit groups around the country on silent-auction donations and personal-training consultations. "It's a pleasure to help, and we want to reach as many people as possible," she says.

# Drivers, Irons & more

Sure, December is the biggest gift-giving season, but thankfully it's not the only time during the year when we are likely to receive a gift. There are birthdays, anniversaries, graduations, promotions, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and Father's Day to name a few possibilities. And there's no reason not to let it be known that a new club—or clubs—is just what you want. Golf clubs also make a great gift for someone special in your life. If you're unsure of exactly what to put on your list, we've got you covered.

#### DRIVERS

The **Ping G20** (\$299) is popular with professionals and weekend golfers alike; Ping markets the driver as being for all levels. The key is the perimeter weighting and high launch with low spin. The clubhead is slightly heavier and uses a special stock shaft to counter the extra weight. The **Taylor Made R11** (\$399) is fully adjustable so you can change launch angle and face angle. Experiment with the club on, or immediately after, December 25, or hand it to an experienced clubfitter for maximum distance. The white crown and black clubface help to make the R11 especially easy to align. The **Tour Edge Bazooka GeoMax 2** is a tremendous deal with a great street price (around \$69). Tour Edge offers significant technology for a sensible price, and this club is proof of that; it provides almost all the technology of newer models. Power in the GeoMax 2 comes from four weighted cavities in the sole. One caveat: you'll have to hurry as it's being discontinued. You'll see a number of Tour players using the **Titleist 910 D2** (\$399). It's tempting to say this club is for better players; however, mid-handicappers will also benefit from features like the ultra-thin crown design that helps to promote a low center of gravity for medium/high launch for optimum distance.

#### HYBRIDS

Only five years ago it was rare to see a touring professional use a hybrid, but today, just about every pro uses one. If you haven't joined the hybrid club you may be convinced by one of these. The **Cobra Baffler Rail H** (\$99) features a rail sole design that makes the club glide over good lies and creates stability from really bad lies. For the ultimate in hybrid technology, turn to the company that essentially started the revolution, Adams. The **Adams a12 Pro** (\$199) has a hot face and improved forgiveness.

#### IRONS

A good New Year's resolution would be to hit more greens and that means new irons. If you're a better player, or if you're aiming to lower that handicap in 2012, try the **Mizuno MP-68s** (\$899). These are classic muscleback irons but with some forgiveness; the grain-flow forging provides superb feel. If you want maximum forgiveness in your irons, go for the **Callaway RAZR X 4-SW** irons (\$699). Callaway calls its 'RAZR Technology' the next generation of iron design—providing excellent forgiveness with significant workability.

#### WEDGES & PUTTERS

On the rare occasions you miss a green, a solid wedge is a must. The beat rolls on at Cleveland with the **Cleveland CG15 Oil Quench Tour Zip** (\$119), which has a traditional shape but is packed with impressive technology. This wedge has a laser-milled face for the maximum allowable spin, as well as the Cleveland Golf Zip Grooves. As we all know, whether we choose to admit it or not, the putter is ultimately the most important club in the bag. If you're really serious about lowering your scores and you want to give yourself a wonderful golf gift, then a custom-fitted putter is perfect. A good choice is the recently introduced **Ping Karsten 1959** (about \$99), with the classic Anser shape. The elastomer insert provides improved feel, but real results come from having the putter custom-fitted. Contact your local PGA professional for a fitting session.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

The holiday season is a good time to get juniors into the game, and most of the major manufacturers make excellent junior sets. A good one is the **Callaway Golf X Junior SIX- Piece Set** (\$199), which provides the same technology as the adult X models.

If new golf apparel is on the agenda, the **Tehama Women's V-Neck Argyle Sweater Vest** (\$55) has the classic argyle print. If there's a trip to Scotland or Ireland coming up in 2012, you'll need to invest in waterproofs. Start your quest for outerwear that will stand up to the worst the British Isles can throw at you with the **FootJoy DryJoys Performance Light Jacket** (\$170); it comes with a two-year limited waterproof warranty.

Speaking of playing in the rain, or even just especially hot temps, golfers find that maintaining a solid grip can be difficult. The **iTac2 Sports Grip** comes from Australia, and it originated surprisingly in the sport of fitness pole dancing. iTac is made from organic beeswax and will not build up on the grips. It's a good stocking stuffer.

A few years ago, most golfers were hunting and pecking for yardage markers. Today, technology has provided golfers with several ways to find exact distances. The latest GPS data is right out of a James Bond movie: the **Garmin Approach S1 Wrist Watch** (\$249) provides precise distances to the front, middle and back of the green—in a watch. It comes preloaded with 14,000 courses.

Enjoy this season and all those to come in 2012, and remember to visit your local PGA or LPGA professional to help you improve your technique—and for top equipment fitting and advice.

It's the time of the year when players look back at the season and ask the question, "How did it go?" For former Colorado State University player and PGA Tour professional **Marin Laird**, the answer is: Very well.

Laird won the Arnold Palmer Invitational in March, raking in a \$1 million winner's check. He finished the season 31st on the PGA official money list and was 40th in the World Golf Rankings in early November with just a few events remaining.

Kevin Stadler tied for 23rd, missed the cut and tied for 73rd in his final three events to remain just inside the top 125 (111). Stadler will keep his full status on the PGA tour next year. He finished the year with \$768,172 in official earnings.

David Duval is one of those players for whom the bubble seems to keep popping rather propping. He finished 152 on the money list, making him reliant on sponsor exemptions or a strong finish in PGA Tour Q-School. In 2010, Duval earned his card back by

*Discover Northern Colorado's*  
**Golf Course Living**

Between the manmade amenities and what nature offers, these communities lack for nothing

**N**orthern Colorado has some of the state's nicest golf courses as well as incredible views of the Front Range. It also offers some of the most affordable golf course living in the state.

**Highland Meadows** in Windsor is one community to consider. The Highland Meadows Golf Course opened for play in 2004. Designed by Art Schaupeter, the championship layout features five teeing grounds and plays 7,011 yards from the tips. *Golf Digest* ranked it the No. 5 most affordable public golf course in America. The links-style layout features natural grasses, pot bunkers and amazing views of the Front Range.

As for living at Highland Meadows, amenities include a pool, tennis courts, a tavern and a big red barn that has been converted into a special-events center for weddings and other special occasions. The subdivision, which is currently a little over a third developed, features homes priced from \$400,000 to \$1.8 million. There are currently 30-plus resale homes available and several lots are for sale as well. Lot buyers can select among top northern Colorado builders to design a custom home. When the community is complete, there will be a total of 696 homes surrounding the course.



Highland Meadows

Just a couple miles east sits **Pelican Lakes Golf and Country Club**, a semi-private golf club that opened in 1999. Located on the southern edge of Windsor and designed by world-renowned golf course architect Ted Robinson Sr., the Pelican Lakes course is surrounded by five lakes and traverses the Cache la Poudre River four times, giving it the most shoreline of any golf course in the United States. In 2006, Pelican Falls Golf Course was added, a nine-hole executive course featuring incredible elevation changes overlooking Water Valley.

Pelican Lakes is one of only a handful of golf communities in the state that offers not just golf among its recreational outlets but also water sports. There are no homes adjacent to the golf course; however, there are several waterfront homes with course views, and there are plenty of lakefront lots still available. All new homeowners receive two free years of golf. The community offers

plenty of home styles to choose from, starting with new private residences in the \$300,000 to \$600,000 range. Resale homes climb to \$1 million. Lot pricing starts at just over \$62,000 for a greenbelt lot and \$85,000 for a lakefront lot; low-maintenance patio homes start at \$300,000 and go to the low \$500s. Pelican Lakes also offers a variety of townhomes, and although new construction in the townhome community is completely sold out, there are several resale townhomes with price ranges beginning in the upper \$100s. Pelican Lakes also offers condos starting in the mid \$100s.

About an hour drive northwest of Windsor is Red Feather Lakes, a prime camping hot spot for northern Coloradoans for decades. As popular as Red Feather Lakes is to many of its regular visitors, few are aware of one of the area's hidden gems, **Fox Acres**. Fox Acres may be one of Colorado's best kept secrets. This quote by Carrie Harney, director of marketing for the community, speaks volumes about the area: "Fox Acres is home to some of the most beautiful land in all of America. This country club community is nothing less than magical, from its flowering meadows to its streams and woodlands. Living here is like living nowhere else."

The private gated community of Fox Acres is home to one of Colorado's Top Ten private golf courses. Nestled onto 460 pristine acres and set deep in the Roosevelt National Forest, the Fox Acres community is intimate with an easygoing charm—and is designed to remain that way. It's located one mile from Red Feather Lakes Village, a small mountain community that offers restaurants and a public library. Public lake fishing and boating is available in the village area as well. Amenities in the gated community and club include the par-71, John Cochran-designed championship course, 24-hour security, dining and social activities, unlimited fly fishing on 13 stocked lakes, tennis courts, non-golf and ladies' events and a Vita-Course Fitness Trail. There are also facilities for corporate meetings as well as rental units available for members and their guests. Surrounding it all are the

rugged peaks of the majestic Rockies and meadows, streams, and woodlands where residents and visitors can hike, bike and pursue countless other activities.

Although real estate at Fox Acres is limited to approximately 250 homes, there are currently 49 active properties ranging in price from the mid \$300,000s to \$1.475 million, many with views of the golf course, lakes and mountains.



# Great Golfers Great Wines

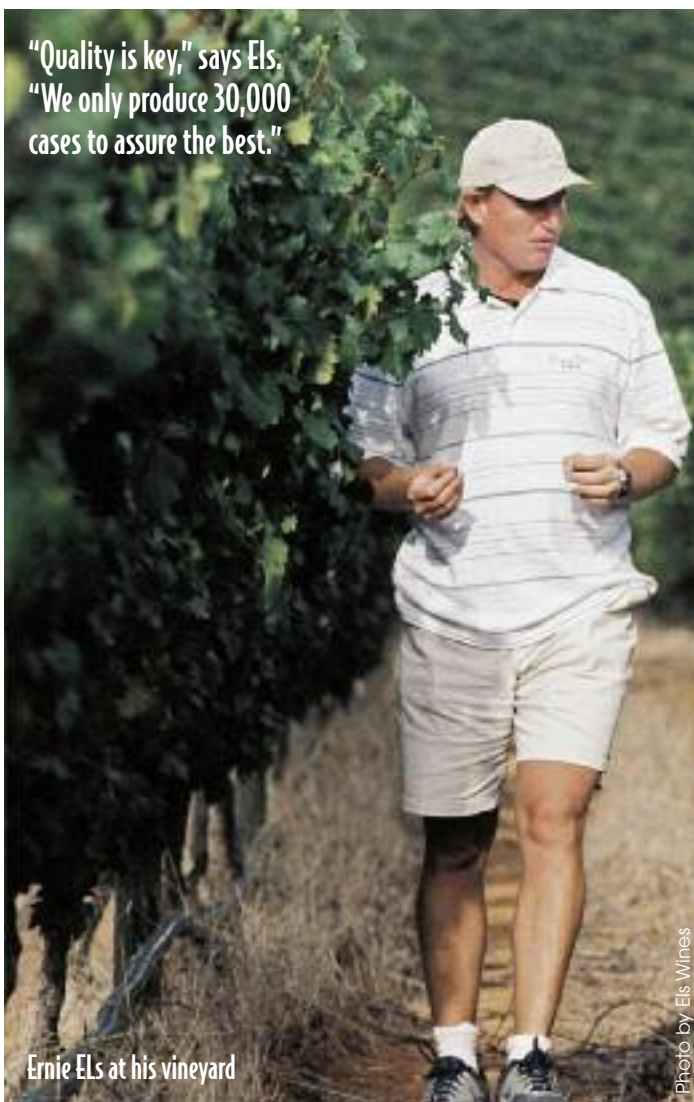
Four pros make it clear that creating exceptional wine isn't just a hobby, it's a passion

## Ernie Els Wines

Ernie Els and fine wine started a love affair over a decade ago. In 1999, Els joined with his friend, winemaker Jean Engelbrecht, to start making wine in the Stellenbosch region of South Africa, an area famous for producing superior red wines. Sun and great soil are key components on the high, northern slopes of Helderberg Mountain, as are cooler summer breezes from the Atlantic, which produce a longer ripening season. Louis Strydom joined Els Wines at the very beginning, and today is winemaker and managing director of the brand.

The first Ernie Els Wines, a selection of reds, first appeared in 2000 in South Africa. By 2002 the first award was received. The Els Wine portfolio currently consists of six red wines, and US distribution is developing rapidly. Els says that two whites, a Chardonnay and a Sauvignon Blanc, will be added this year.



Ernie Els Signature Blend 2006, made from five Bordeaux varieties, portrays the unique terroir of Stellenbosch on the palette. Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Malbec and Petit Verdot are micro-vinified separately. For 20 months the wine is aged in 300-litre French oak barrels, then it matures for 18 months in bottles. The result is a truly superb wine—so superb it was featured for \$140 per bottle at the elegant Kahala Hotel & Resort on Oahu during the 2011 Sony Open, played on the course adjacent to the resort.

Ernie Els Big Easy 2009 is a “must.” Full bodied with great structure from Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz grapes, it has a gentle, easy follow-through.

“Quality is key,” says Els. “We only produce 30,000 cases to assure the best.”



## Frost Wines

Another notable South African golfer, David Frost says, “My talent is golf but my passion is wine.” After success on both sides of the Atlantic, Frost now plays the Champions Tour. Growing up in wine country where his family has been involved in the business for more than 60 years, Frost picked grapes to have pocket money for golf. When he was young, golf was his focus. His father started golfing and got him playing. School vacations were only about golf,

and at boarding school during his two-hour break, he would run three miles to the golf course, practice, then run back.

In 1994, Frost acquired his “own” vineyard in Paarl, South Africa. Initially, he and winemaker Jason Fisher collaborated on 3000 cases of Cabernet Sauvignon, which garnered a 90+ *Wine Spectator* note. “We focused on quality,” Frost stressed. They also produced an Artist Series with the labels by LeRoy Neiman for several years, as well as wines for Arnold Palmer (1999) and Jack Nicklaus (2001).

In 2002 Frost started ‘Par Excellence,’ blending reds (cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc) and producing only 500 cases. Success. Today, test the David Frost Shiraz 2006 and Cabernet Sauvignon 2007. Look for older vintages too. “News is Sauvignon Blanc in 2011,” Frost said, “We stopped our Chardonnay in 2001.” Frost’s passion is a wine lovers delight.

### Greg Norman Estate

The Great White Shark needs no introduction—either as a golfer or as a businessman. He has achieved success in diverse realms, including wine. Greg Norman Estates brings together the Shark’s favorite selections as an avid wine collector, from both Australia and California. In 1999 the Greg Norman Estates Australian wine portfolio got raves from *Wine Spectator*, including a

World Top 10 (2004) for its 1999 South Eastern Australia Reserve Shiraz. In 2005 Norman introduced a collection of California varietals, from Santa Barbara Chardonnay to Lake County Zinfandel, obtaining more awards to go with his prize-winning Australian portfolio.

“If you’ve been a competitor in the past,” Norman says, “no matter where you are, on a golf course, in business, or in life, you want to be the best you can be. My

goal of Greg Norman Estates is to over-deliver from a quality and value perspective. I believe every bottle delivers on that promise.”

### Curvature by Cristie Kerr

Golf, grapes and giving are Cristie Kerr’s focus. Curvature is produced in partnership with Suzanne Pride Bryan, patron of Pride Mountain Vineyards in St. Helena, Calif. Kerr had the initial New York tasting of her 2006 Cabernet Sauvignon (only 350 cases) at the Country Club of Rochester following her victory at the 2010 Wegmans LPGA Championship.

A new release this spring was the 2009 Curvature Chardonnay by Pride Vineyards, touted as “sensational.” Kerr is involved in all phases of her wines and their release. She was very proud when the White House ordered two cases of her 2007 Cabernet Sauvignon for a state dinner honoring extraordinary women.

This October, the 2008 Cabernet Sauvignon will be released. Sales are mainly to the U.S. country club market as well as top-level hotels and golf resorts. Kerr donates a portion of sales revenues to her Birdies for Breast Cancer charity, which she started in honor of her mother Linda, a survivor.

# Il Bistrotro Italiano

A true taste of Italy in Grand Junction, with authentic recipes,  
fresh ingredients and culinary events

You hear “authentic” often in restaurant marketing, but Grand Junction’s Il Bistro Italiano has a credible case for using it. Owner-chef Brunella Gualerzi is a native of Italy’s Emilia-Romagna, an area rich in culinary history. She travels to her hometown to get Parmesan cheese and visits the local butcher for a carefully guarded secret spice blend to make

we do at Il Bistro Italiano is a lot of traditional Northern Italian food, supplemented by my own dishes invented over the years, but still created within the boundaries of Italian cuisines.” While she remains fiercely proud of her heritage, she is dedicated to supporting her community. “I use local ingredients as much as possible: a lot of Colorado cheese, lamb, chicken and bison, and serve only Italian and Colorado wines.”

Family recipes are key. “My mom is a wonderful cook for lasagna and osso buco and things like that, very traditional in my area. We use only the best ingredients and make all our sausages in house with spices from the butcher in my village—he won’t give me the recipe. I like herbs and spices and garlic, but I don’t use 50 ingredients. When I make tomato sauce, you taste fresh tomatoes from the field.”

In addition to the sausages, pastas and desserts are also created from scratch, and Gualerzi says the menu changes quite often. Seasonal selections complement a core group of dishes that are available virtually year-round, such as popular Rosetta, a homemade pasta rolled with rosemary, ham and provolone cheese, then baked and served with a spicy, tomato-cream sauce.

Some dishes come back every season while others stay on the menu all the time because there would be “a riot otherwise,” Gualerzi says. Her mom’s osso buco is a continual favorite, and customers were clamoring for pumpkin-and-butternut-roll pasta weeks before this year’s fall menu was unveiled. “We cannot *not* put it on the menu,” she says.

The restaurant offers gluten-free selections, including gluten-free corn pasta, and a number of vegetarian options.

homemade sausage. Her restaurant’s menus are based on family recipes as well as centuries of traditional Italian guidelines. So traditional that customers who order spaghetti and meatballs receive them as separate dishes.

“In Italy, we don’t eat them together,” Gualerzi says matter-of-factly, and sticks to her guns when requested to serve them the Americanized way on one plate. She admits it may have cost her a few dinner checks, but devotees are hooked. In fact, she continually hears from savvy travelers that her restaurant offers food that is as good, or even better, than restaurants in Italy.

Called simply “The Bistro” by locals, Gualerzi opened the restaurant in 1998. “We have a lot of regulars,” she says. “The first couple of years were difficult because people expected Americanized spaghetti and meatballs. But over the years they have learned to appreciate it.” She adds, “I come from Bibbiano, in the province of Reggio Emilia, an area that is famous for food—homemade pastas, balsamic vinegar and Parmesan cheese invented 900 years ago. Because I was born and raised in Italy, what





“Traditional Italian cuisine is based on poor people who didn’t eat meat a lot,” Gualerzi notes, “so we’ve always had quite a few vegetarian entrées that make us popular among vegetarians—more than thrown-together veggies with pasta.”

Located in the heart of Grand Junction, Il Bistro Italiano is housed in a 100-year-old building featuring a simple brick-and-wood interior, two dining rooms and a smaller area for private

functions for up to 30 people. Customized menus can be served family-style. An open kitchen and bar area highlight the front part of the restaurant, and there’s a small patio for warm, sunny days. Servers are attentive, friendly and knowledgeable. “We do a lot of training because we offer dishes and wines that people aren’t normally familiar with,” Gualerzi says.

The restaurant hosts a monthly tapas night with a menu of 18-22 small-plate choices beyond traditional Spanish selections. Gualerzi teaches Italian cooking on Saturday mornings and offers multi-course regional dinners with wine pairings throughout the year, so popular they sell out four or five months in advance. She works with local wineries to produce special events, and annually cuts a wheel of Parmesan from her home region in Italy, complemented by a dinner created to utilize, “the best Parmesan cheese ever.” Off-site catering is available as well.

Il Bistro Italiano is open Monday-Friday from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. and dinner is served daily from 4:30-9 p.m., until 8 p.m. on Sundays. For reservations (recommended) call 970.243.8662. For sample menus and a calendar of events, log onto [ilbistroitaliano.com](http://ilbistroitaliano.com)

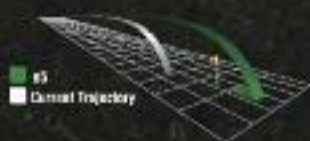

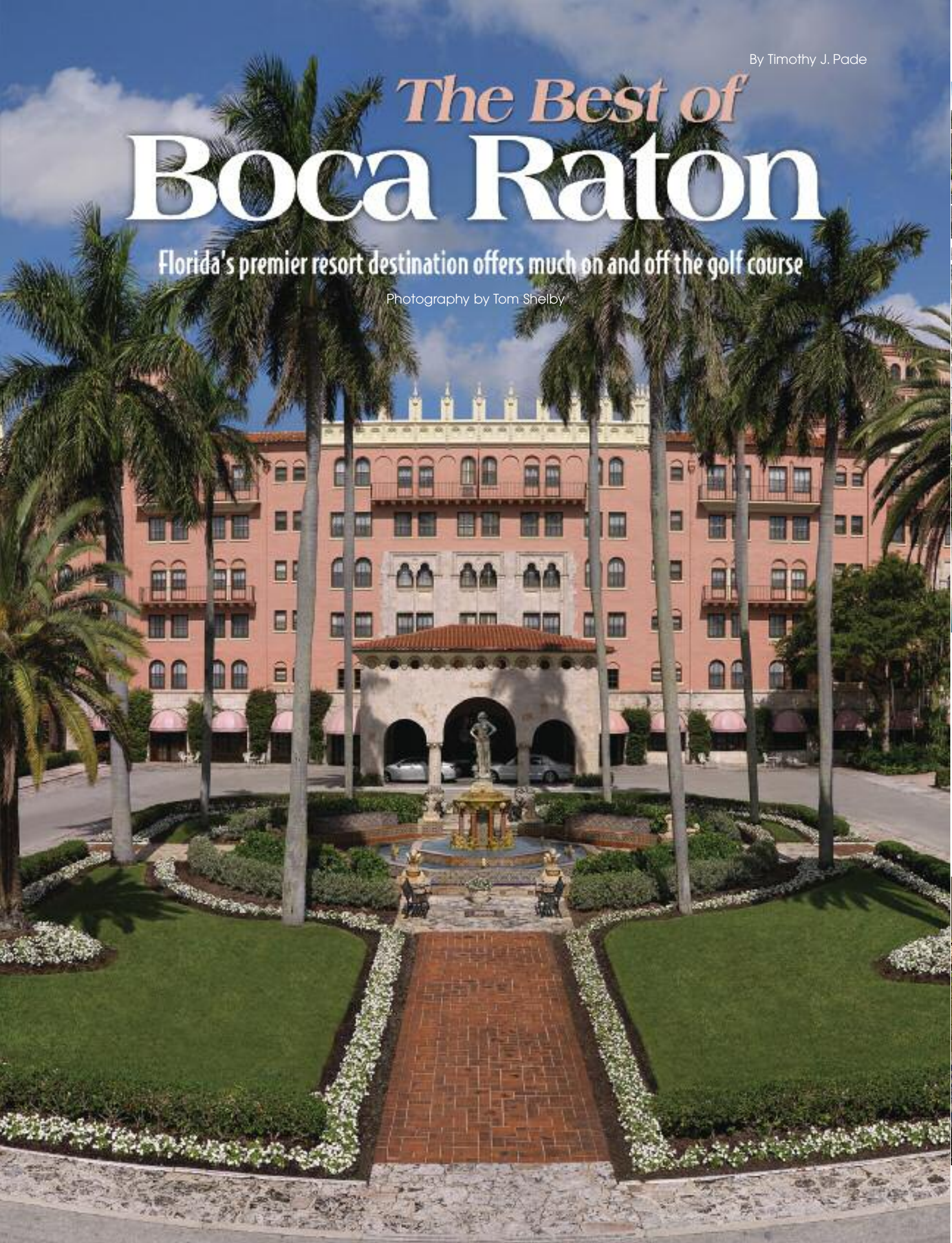

# Acura ZDX

Coupe, sedan or sport utility vehicle? You decide



The Acura ZDX is a shape shifter. You want the power of a sports car? Buckle into a 300 horsepower V-6 and enjoy. You want the spaciousness and comfort of an SUV? Take a run up to the mountains and put the all-wheel drive to the test.

Acura's first-ever female designer, Michelle Christensen, brought the ZDX to life in 2009. Christensen balanced the masculine and feminine design elements well in the aggressive front end and rounded rear fenders. The six-speed automatic has so many options to choose from, you'll wonder if you're driving something that came straight out of a James Bond movie.

In its new design studio in Torrance, Calif., Acura went to work using a new team approach. The interior and exterior teams worked together. It seems like common sense, but this doesn't happen often in the auto industry. The result is a car that drives like a roadster when you want it and like an ocean liner when you're in the mood for sailing.

Quiet, responsive and sporty are thoughts that might come to you as you drive the ZDX around town. The Integrated Dynamics System (IDS) system engages shock absorbers in order to customize the drive to your demands. In comfort mode, the ZDX



requires less effort to steer and rides like a magic carpet. In sport mode, you're ready to race Le Mans.

Three hundred horsepower doesn't have to accompany a car with a perpetual appetite for fuel. The ZDX is getting 23 mpg on the highway with approximately the same wheelbase and curb weight of a Porsche Cayenne. The ZDX has a 21-gallon gas tank that allows for a mega trip without having to refuel. All-wheel drive comes standard and makes the ride exceptionally sticky in the corners and snow.

Don't let the coupe fool you. You can easily fit a set of skis and snowboards the ZDX. This four-door has rear folding seats and enough cargo room to make a trip to the slopes or the golf course easy. The leather-stitched dash along with the glass roof gives the ZDX an unprecedented style factor that isn't typical Acura branding.

"The ZDX is like nothing you have ever seen before from Acura," Jeff Conrad, vice president of Acura sales, said in a statement. "It combines the best attributes of a coupe, a sedan and a sport utility—all wrapped in a beautifully sculpted package—that will attract an entirely new luxury customer to the Acura brand."





The style element is enhanced by the fact that it isn't a boxy machine devoid of frills like so many other crossovers that have died a painful death. Rather than load the car with auxiliary power jacks and faux camping accessories, Acura took time to deliver features that actually get used. The navigation system with real-time traffic and Zagat reviews is a cornerstone of the operating system. A sound system with a 15GB hard drive and iPod connection makes it practical and user-friendly. An optional Active Sound Control system reduces road noise by as much as 10dB using opposing sound frequencies through the audio-system speakers. These features put the price tag around \$56,000

"Compared to the BMW X6, it's \$20,000 less with more standard features," says Dan Gorath, sales representative at Mile High Acura in Denver. "It's a car with a lot of versatility."

The safety of the ZDX is the piece of this performance pie that makes it even sweeter. The Collision Mitigation Braking System could save lives. Powered by a radar transmitter mounted in the ZDX grille, a signal is constantly transmitted and the return signal is evaluated, determining the distance and closing speed to vehicles that lie directly ahead. If the distance between you and the vehicle ahead reduces, a warning signal is given to alert you to slow down. If the ZDX predicts that a collision is imminent, the seat belts are tightened and brakes applied immediately.



The ZDX is also loaded with Acura's blind-spot information system. The feature monitors the back half of the ZDX where it is difficult for drivers to see other vehicles. When another car is traveling in that area, an indicator illuminates on that side of the ZDX on the windshield pillar. Nothing annoying, but enough to keep you from having a very bad day.

The ZDX has the power and grace to keep you comfortable and enjoying your daily commute. Do you want power or grace? I choose BOTH.
