Vail's ski-racing Olympic golden girl has worked her whole life to reap the rewards of 2010

he Lindsey Vonn media frenzy began in earnest when she was pictured on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* prior to the 2010 winter Olympic Games. Under the photo of Vonn in a classic alpine ski "tuck" position, the smiling 25-year-old was hailed as "America's Best Woman Skier Ever." Instead of praising her accomplishments, some publicly chastised her for what they called a sexually suggestive pose.

Vonn wasn't mad, but incredulous. "I heard about it after the Olympics and it's completely ridiculous —that cover pose is how I ski race," she says. "I guess it's how you take it yourself, but for me it's my sport. I felt like after the Olympics, people somehow thought I was an attention-seeker because of the hype going in. I'm not seeking attention. It's just me trying to be the best ski racer I can be." Winning America's first Olympic gold medal in women's downhill and a bronze for Super G was, Vonn says, "definitely a dream come true. A bad shin injury wasn't the way I wanted to go into Vancouver, but I gave it my best in every race. I had chances for more medals, but I took chances. I'm really happy about the results. I'd been dreaming about a gold medal since I was a little kid and it was the most emotional race of my life, for myself and my family. I had been working toward that for a long time, so it was overwhelming."

Vonn's accomplishments didn't end at the Olympics. She also won the women's World Cup overall championship in March—only the second woman to win the title three years in a row. Husband Thomas Vonn is her coach. "We have a really great relationship on and off the hill," she says. "He's supportive. He's been

in the sport [he was in the 2002 Olympics] and knows what I'm going through. I'm instinctual and he's detail-oriented, and it's important to have good communication. We're together almost 24/7. Every time I'm on the hill he's there, as well as at home together. Personally, I'm most proud of my marriage. It's been the single most life-changing event of my life, an extremely happy journey with him."

At season's end, Vonn walked away with two ESPY awards, hit the talk-show circuit and appeared in the final episode of *Law and Order*, her favorite TV show. She took an uncommon amount of time off—two months—and an extremely rare opportunity to ski





for fun with friends in Vail. But this summer she was back in the gym before training on the slopes of New Zealand in August and Chile in September, and she heads to Europe in October for the this start of year's ski-racing season.

"There are titles I have to defend out there," she says. "It's a long, long year for us — intense, but I love it."

Her gym program, six to eight hours per day, is based on biking and endurance training three to five days a week. Add to that core, weightlifting, coordination, agility and balance training. She also plays tennis to cross-train.

"When I'm in the gym, I'm thinking about what my competitors are doing," she says, "and I always want to do more. It keeps me motivated and hungry for more."

Workouts don't stop during competition. On a race day, "I do a workout at 5 or 6 a.m., warm up on the hill, look at the course and do some runs to get my feet underneath me before the race," she says. At the race start, "I'm visualizing the course in my mind, making sure I'm ready. In the gate I kind of relax myself. I get almost too excited and there's a lot of adrenalin, so I have to calm myself down. I'm thinking of my goals: being aggressive or staying forward. I say small ski words to focus on the task."

Vonn hits speeds of 80 to 85 mph on a downhill run. "I'm never afraid of going fast," she says. "That's why I love downhill so much. It's basically you against the mountain and the clock, and pushing yourself as hard as you can. I push past the limit sometimes and that means I crash. But that's part of the sport.



"Basically I've been ski racing since I was eight or nine years old, and there have been a lot of sacrifices along the way that have thankfully paid off. I missed going to prom and didn't date or have a social life — I was always on the road. At the same time I didn't notice it because I loved ski racing and traveling and having those experiences. I wouldn't change it. I just want to be the best in my sport. I'm trying to be a better person and athlete, and make improvements."

Vonn makes appearances off the slopes as well. At a charity golf tournament in June, she used a five iron to make a hole-in-one on the par 3 No. 6 at California's Bayonet Course at Monterey Bay. "It was totally unexpected. I had a good swing. I didn't see the ball go in, I just thought I hit a good shot. It was pretty cool." She's played only sporadically over the last three years, ever since her father-in-law gave her "a few pointers." The Monterey event was just her second time to play 18 complete holes.

Looking ahead, Vonn is not only thinking about another gold medal in the next winter Olympics, but also about the 2015 world championships in Vail, her hometown.

"Vail is a huge mountain. You can ski forever and ever and never see the same trail twice. There's not one resort in Europe that comes close to the magnitude of Vail — it's definitely the best in the world. I love the town and feel a part of the community. Vail is a mountain town and a place where I'm connected really well with welcoming people."

Before the 2010 Olympics, Vonn was more famous in Europe than in mainstream America, but now she's getting fan mail from kids in elementary school. "It's inspiring to me," she says." I'm trying to give back and be the best role model I can be."

Hasta luego Lotena Ochoa

The No. I woman golfer in the world has left competitive play, but there is no doubt that she will continue to be a force off the course

n earthquake shook the world of women's golf in April when the No. 1 female player in the world — popular, friendly and vivacious Lorena Ochoa — announced that she was retiring from competitive golf at 28 years young. Three years to the date that she first ascended to the top of the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings, Ochoa held an emotional press conference and withdrew from the LPGA Tour. She will play in only a few events and in her annual invitational tournament in Guadalajara, Mexico, where she grew up.

A tremendously talented athlete and an explosive golfer with extraordinary abilities, Ochoa created a chain of friendship wherever she played. Fans and groundskeepers alike felt her generosity of spirit. She was even known to cook breakfast for tournament support staff. Unpretentious, giving, open and accessible, Ochoa marked golf indelibly in her short, meteoric career. "This is a special day for me," she said. "I have been wanting this for a time, dreaming of it, a decision from my heart with joy. I am happy, in peace. Thank you all. I always wanted to play my last event in Mexico; it will be Morelia next week.

"Now is a new life," she continued, "a normal person's life, and giving back to my family plus working on my interests and the Lorena Ochoa foundation. I have always wanted to be remembered as a person, for what I do outside of the golf course."

Until her marriage last December to Aeromexico executive Anders Conesa, Ochoa was still living at home with her parents. Conesa, a father of three children, is 12 years her senior. Ochoa wants to have a year or so to travel with him before they start their own family.



Perhaps nowhere was that more apparent than in Mexico City the night before her globally broadcast press conference. Friends, family and sponsors—Rolex, Lacoste, Ping and Banamex among them—came from across the world to share in an emotional evening filled with memories, good wishes, tears, laughter and joy. Ochoa is an icon like no other in Mexico, but she is also revered worldwide. Family has been key in Ochoa's journey. Alejandro, her brother and manager, has been her constant travel companion. Her father and other family members and friends have been present with her as she played her way to the top of the Tour. It's not just her amazing shot-making that will be missed but also her smile and spontaneity.

As a Rolex Ambassador, Ochoa will continue to play a role for golf and charity.







"We respect her decision. It is her life. Of course we are sad," declared Jean-Noel Bioul of Rolex at dinner the evening before the press conference. To Ochoa he declared, "You will still be with us, part of the Rolex family."

Since her first LPGA win in 2004 at the Franklin American Mortgage Championship, Ochoa has amassed 27 wins including two majors—the 2007 Women's British Open at St. Andrews and the 2008 Kraft Nabisco Championship in Rancho Mirage when



she famously jumped into the lake at the 18th green with her parents, brother, caddie and a slew of friends and family while a mariachi band played.

Her career seemed to be destiny. At the University of Arizona she set records with 12 NCAA collegiate golf victories. She made first team All-American in 2002 with the same stellar performances that she had in Junior Golf. After turning professional in May 2002, she won three events on the Futures Tour and finished at No. 1, giving her exempt status for the 2003 LPGA season. She was 2003 Rolex Rookie of the Year, and her fiery, aggressive play catapulted her into the rankings and record books.

Yet even at the young age of 20 she was focused as much on life beyond golf as on reaching the highest pinnacle of her game. "By 30," she said, "I want to be number one in the world, then I will stop golf, get married and have children."

She echoed this thought several years later when discussing Annika Sorenstam's decision to step away from competitive golf. As she made that same decision herself, it was with the courage of her longheld convictions and in pursuit of another long-held dream.

Ochoa became Rolex World Number One in 2007, succeeding Annika Sorenstam. About Ochoa's departure from competitive golf Sorentsam said, "I was surprised, but not shocked when I heard the news. She has accomplished so much in such a short time. It is hard to play and play at the level you demand of yourself when your heart and mind are somewhere else. I am very happy for her."

Brittany Lincicome, 2009 Kraft Nabisco Champion who succeeded Ochoa, echoed the sentiments of many

Tour colleagues. "She's been an amazing leader on the LPGA tour. She will be greatly missed but I'm soooo happy that she is putting herself first! I wish her nothing but the best in the future."

Ochoa has been true to her Mexican heritage, her faith, family, friends and golf. She has brought an image of warmth, excitement, respect and pride to the Tour and to the organizations to which she has lent her support. There is no doubt that she will be remembered just as she hoped to be: for what she has accomplished on the golf course and beyond the golf course, too. Viva, viva, viva Lorena and *hasta luego*.

or the 28th straight year, the PGA Tour makes a fall stop in Las Vegas. The event, which has undergone numerous name changes but for the past two years has been the Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, is set for Oct. 18-24 at TPC Summerlin, one of Vegas' impressive private courses.

The tournament is chock full of history, from Tiger Woods' first PGA Tour victory (1996) to Jim Furyk's back-to-back wins (1998 and 1999, in addition to his win in 1995).

experience. And I was really proud how I played. I hit it just as well today as I have any other day.

"Even though I was nervous coming down the stretch, my second shot on 16 was probably the best shot I ever hit. I had to hit it perfect to get over the water. The wind is to the left, I tend to hit a cut. It was a tough shot for me to start out left and not lose it too far right with the water. That was a do-or-die shot. To pull it off, and it was probably the best swing I ever made, that was a big moment."

The Las Vegas tournament still has high hopes to move into the



But Las Vegas charities are the real winners in this tournament as millions of dollars have been raised over the years to help benefit those in need. After the victory, his first on the Tour, Laird was emotional. "It's the first time I'm ever in the final group," he told the media. "It's the first time I'm really in contention in the last round. It's a learning

spring schedule on the PGA Tour, but whether that happens, and how soon, depends on many factors.

"It's always a goal for everyone in the fall season to get into the regular season with the bigger tournaments," said Mike Zampini, operations and marketing manager for the tournament. "But, we're on the right track. It all depends on other tournament sponsorships, giving back to the community and being successful. We're in a good position, but we know we still have work to do." That work includes getting more fans out to the course during tournament week. "There are an awful lot of entertainment things to do in Vegas," Zampini added. "We're doing our best to make sure the golf tournament is one of those choices."

The field over the past two years has been strong and Zampini believes 2010 will be just as strong.

"Jim Furyk and Anthony Kim being here last year was great," he said. "And Fred Couples came here two years ago. The families get to come out to Vegas and it says a lot that these guys want to come out to Vegas and play the event."

Rickie Fowler, a new Vegas resident, made his pro debut in last year's tournament and finished tied for seventh. Furyk tied for fourth.

Then there's also the benefit of the host being a musical genius. Timberlake headlines a concert during tournament week each year and, obviously, it's a huge draw for players and fans.

So now it's up to the fans to come out and add their support to a tournament that makes a huge difference to the families of children in need of medical care. According to Zampini, more than 25 charities are out selling tickets to the event this year to support the tournament and the charities that benefit from it.

"It's a great tournament with a great field," he said. "And, it's in a great city — Las Vegas. That adds up to a great week."

Find the best golf ball By Scott Martin for your gane

Which Golf Ball Will Help You Lower Your Score and Improve Your Financial Situation?

Colorado Golf Magazine's equipment expert tells you what you need to know about choosing the right ball for your game

ifteen years ago, golf ball choices were somewhat stark. Golfers could choose between a soft, high-spinning ball with a fragile balata cover and a wrist-jarring two-piece ball with what seemed like a concrete core and cover hard enough to shatter the face of a persimmon wood. Construction advances have narrowed the gap significantly between the rock and the soft place, but compromises exist. If you're looking for a ball that's long, durable, totally controllable around the greens, a breeze to hit in the wind and also costs less than \$20 for a 24 pack, it's not happening.

The most convenient way to group golf balls today is by price. A good and perfectly serviceable ball costs under \$20 per dozen. The ball will feel fine off all clubs, reward good shots and perform well enough for most golfers. The primary drawback is in durability: To keep costs low, manufacturers use a cover material like ionomer in the cheaper balls, which tends to get scuffed up fairly easily. Solid options include the Wilson D-25 Distance, the Srixon AD333, the Top-Flite Gamer V2 and the Top-Flite Eagle.

In the past three years, manufacturers have dramatically improved the mid-tier golf balls in the \$20 to \$35 range. Balls in this 'better' category typically have three-piece construction and will hit the brakes fairly quickly on chip shots and pitch shots. However, cover materials can still be lacking. A well-struck wedge, especially one with extra grippy grooves, can leave an impression on these balls. Players looking for a ball with a urethane cover, which is the most durable, might like the TaylorMade TP Black LDP. Other solid choices in this price range include the Bridgestone E6, the Titleist NXT Tour and the Wilson StaffC:25.

The frugal golfer may become a bit perturbed when facing the option of spending \$45 for a dozen golf balls. Ironically, the most expensive ball may be the best option for you if you're value conscious, provided you're a player who keeps the ball out of water, waist-high rough, barrancas and other ball-munching hazards. The urethane cover found on most of the top-tier balls stavs blemish free unless you send a bunker shot 144 yards. These premium golf balls reduce the trade-off disparity: you get distance off the tee, workability, beautiful feel, durability and control around the greens. The most famous ball in this category is the Titleist Pro V1 and V1x, but Nike (One Tour/Tour D), Srixon (Z-Star/Z-Star X), Callaway, i(s)/i(z) and TaylorMade (the five-layer Penta TP) all make superbly crafted balls. Bridgestone offers four balls in its premium family of B330 balls, providing more options for more golfers.

Golfers will quite correctly spend hundreds on a fitted driver then fail to ask their PGA or LPGA professional about the best golf ball for their game. There are two key variables: spin and launch angle. A player who naturally spins the ball will benefit from a ball with lower spin; a player with low spin (and probably low ball speed) may benefit from a ball with higher spin. Is it absolutely vital for precise short game scoring to use a ball in the premium range? Absolutely not. An inexpensive ball will spin around the green and a good player can adapt around the green. While there are exceptions, typically a less



expensive ball will have a higher launch angle than a more expensive ball. If you hit the ball a mile in the air, you may need a ball with a lower launch angle.

The United States Golf Association has approved well over a thousand golf

balls, among them the Chromax Metallic. There are two models: the Metallic l and the Metallic 2, available in six colors, none of which are white. The balls are the product of chemical engineer and avid golfer Stuart Chin who lives in Taiwan and purchased a golf-ball manufacturing facility four years ago.

In Japan, the ball is second in popularity only to the Titleist Pro V1. The Metallic1 is a 75-compression ball and is best for juniors and ladies. The Metallic2 is an 85compression ball and is an excellent choice for the "average" golfer with clubhead speeds in the 85 to 100 mph range. The ball uses two-piece construction, has soft feel and putts and chips well; the cover material is a trade secret.

The Chromax Metallic sells successfully in Colorado. Golfers buy it initially, according to the manufacturer, for the novelty but keep playing it for the performance and the visibility — the ball is significantly easier to see past 150 yards. Clearly the ball has something going for it: it's in the premium price bracket of \$3 to \$4 per ball and moves off the shelves. You can find it in approximately 75 percent of Colorado's golf retail outlets.

Uphill Battles for Centennial State Players

It's been a long, hard year on the professional golf scene for those players with Colorado connections. Don't believe it? Look it up.

On the PGA Tour, only CSU grad Martin Laird, former Colorado High School state champion Kevin Stadler and Cherry Creek resident and former major champion winner David Duval have been regularly playing Tour events, and all of them are squarely on the bubble going into the FedEx Cup playoffs.

Where a player is in the standings makes all the difference. Only the top 125 advance to The Barclays, the first of four FedEx Cup events, and only 100 will advance to the second, the Deutsche Bank Championship. The field for the third event, the BMW Championship, is just 70 players and only the top 30 will go on to the Tour Championship.

After the PGA Championship, Laird, the only Coloradoconnected player to make the cut in the year's final major, is 101 st in the standings, Duval is 115th and Stadler is 117th. Stadler has compiled

four top-10 finishes during 2010, tying for fifth at the Reno-Tahoe Open, for sixth at the Shell Houston Open, for ninth at the Mayakoba Classic in Mexico and for 10th at the Northern Trust Open.

Laird tied for fourth at The SBS Classic and for 10th at The Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial. Duval, who is playing on sponsors' exemptions, recorded his only top-10 finish of 2010 when he tied for second at the AT&T National Pro-Am early in the year at Pebble Beach.

Other Colorado-connected Tour professionals include Brandt Jobe and former PGA Tour winner Jonathan Kaye, but both are splitting time between the PGA Tour (where they have very limited playing status) and the Nationwide Tour.

The same kind of story is being told on the Champions Tour, where only Tommy Armour III, who was born in Denver and now lives in Las Vegas, is in the top 10 in the season-long race for the Charles Schwab Cup. Cherry Creek High School grad Mike Reid is 25th in the standings while Mark Wiebe is 43rd. Three-time U.S. Open champion and former two-sport University of Colorado standout Hale Irwin is 35th, and Gary Hallberg, who finished 40th in the U.S. Senior Open and 36th in the Senior PGA Championship that was played this year at Colorado Golf Club in Parker, is 62nd. Former Masters champion Craig Stadler has the 66th spot.

On the season, Armour III has seven top-10 finishes, Reid three top 10s, Irwin and Wiebe two each while Hallberg and Stadler have cracked the top 10 just once in 2010. Steve Jones, the former U.S. Open champion who learned his game on the sand greens in Yuma, Ariz., before an outstanding college career at CU, celebrated his 50th birthday in December but has yet to make his Champions Tour debut after elbow surgery last year. That was just the latest medical problem of many that have plagued Jones' entire career.

have had the good fortune to play many of the 250+ golf courses in Colorado, and I've had the pleasure of playing a handful of Jim Engh's courses among them. Pradera is one of my favorites. Jim Engh-designed courses always add an element of fun that is simply not as readily apparent on many other courses. Engh's layouts are memorable, unique and you can play the same course 50 times and find a new characteristic each time you play it. That is decidedly true of Pradera.

THE CLUB AT PRADERA

According to Pradera's website, Engh designed the golf course at Pradera to be a blend of "Irish" and "modern" influences." About a third of the holes are predominantly Irish in character, with rolling terrain, open fairway pods to hit to, light and wispy prairie grass roughs, pot bunkers and an overall links feel. Other holes include ponds, cattails, wetlands and layouts that make them more modern and "Americanized." The two elements are blended together into a striking "Irish-Modern course with a Colorado twist."

After playing the course, I can honestly say that on many of the holes I felt like I was in Ireland, far, far away from America. Yet I was just 20 minutes southeast of the Denver Tech Center.

Pradera is a private golf course that opened for play in 2005. It measures 7,300 yards from the back tees, but with five sets of tees and several tee combinations, it's a course is for every level of player.

The Club at Pradera offers year-round recreation, casual and fine dining, camaraderie, tennis courts, a fitness center, locker rooms, lounges and a pro shop. Pradera also has a community center that features a competition-size pool, spray-play area and a sun deck, a catering kitchen and party room. The surrounding park has plenty for young residents, with a tot lot,

basketball/inline hockey court, two soccer/lacrosse fields and a baseball/softball field. A trail system winds throughout the community's open spaces, providing residents with panoramic views and an abundant variety of hikes and bike rides.

Pradera, which was home to the 2005 Parade of Homes featuring many of Colorado's top builders, currently has 62 homes on the market ranging in price form \$350,000 to \$2.15 million. New construction begins with your choice of lots ranging in size from acre to 1.3 acres, and you can choose among 13 custom homebuilders. Prices range from \$388,000 to \$464,000 for a single-family home while golf villas range from \$399,000 to \$612,000. Semi-custom homes are in the mid \$600s and custom homes are priced from \$958,000 to \$1.4 million.

COLORADO GOLF CLUB

A couple miles east of Pradera and due south of Parker is Colorado GolfClub, host of the 2010 Senior PGA Championship. The private 7,604-yard course, designed by architects Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw, plays through open meadows, wooded

hillsides, natural barrancas and streams. It's surrounded by 1,100 acres of open space and the entire property is home to deer, pronghorn antelope, hawks and eagles. With a deliberate absence of homes along its fairways, the layout allows golfers to fully experience the strategic choices and challenges that Coore and Crenshaw laid out, as well as panoramic views from Longs Peak to Pikes Peak. Colorado Golf Club demands imaginative shot-making and will challenge every aspect of a player's game.

In addition to the championship course, Coore and Crenshaw also designed a nine-hole short course with holes measuring 70 to 199 yards. Mike McGetrick, director of golf at the club, is one of the country's top golf instructors. The practice area he designed draws on his experience of more than 20 years of teaching beginners, Tour professionals and everyone in between. The fullswing area includes tees, greens, uneven lies and different turf conditions. The short-game area simulates every short shot imaginable, from bunkers to tight-lie chipping areas to deep rough.

The club is offering a limited number of custom home sites that showcase the natural features and beauty of the surroundings. Architectural guidelines call for natural stone and wood materials and sight lines that will blend into the landscape while maximizing the topography and features of each site.

Home sites at Colorado Golf Club average more than two acres. An extensive trail network connects homes to the clubhouse and other facilities. The Betts Lake community offers a range of floor plans and elevations and Betts Lake homes start at \$1,395,000. Available sites range from just over an acre to several acres and start in the high \$400s. Because this is such a new community, only 13 resale homes are currently available and range from \$595,000 to \$4 million.

CHERRY CREEK COUNTRY CLUB

Cherry Creek Country Club in Southeast Denver is a gated community featuring a 7,405-yard Nicklaus Design Signature golf course that entices golfers of all levels. The numerous lakes and streams, waste bunkers and big greens challenge members and guests, and five sets of tees help players meet those challenges. Cherry Creek Country Club also offers a learning center, driving range, putting greens and chipping areas. A full-service fitness

center and spa, outdoor tennis courts, swimming pools and a grille are available to all members. The clubhouse, built in 2002 and overlooking the 18th green, has sweeping views of the Front Range and provides an inviting backdrop for elegant dining, private functions or socializing.

Cherry Creek Country Club features three styles of homes: the Village series from \$750,000, the Villas from \$1.3 million and the Estates starting at \$1.9 million. Homes feature exteriors of brick and stone similar to the architecture of old Denver. Attached and detached manor homes are available in nine floor plans. The Village features a large lake, cascading waterfalls, lush landscaping and a pedestrian-friendly community with the clubhouse, spa and fitness center just a short stroll from your door. Cherry Creek Country Club is flanked by the Highline Canal on the east side of the



community and the Cherry Creek Trail on the west side. Cherry Creek Trail, which runs through the heart of the Denver Metro area, is great for walking the dog, running, biking and inline skating. Sea World in San Diego

welcome to San Diego

The weather-blessed city has an embarrassment of riches when it comes to golf, recreation, culture and vacation amenities

est known for its near-perfect weather and abundance of outdoor activities, San Diego is consistently rated among the country's top vacation destinations. And it's not just about golf, although the area is home to some of the top resort facilities and golf courses in the nation. Whether you take a day off from the course or want to get out and play come evening, there are plenty of options.

Downtown, the pleasantly walkable Gaslamp Quarter features a lively dining, music and nightlife scene, and California's diverse and colorful history is brought to life in Old Town's historic sites as well as its shops and restaurants. San Diego boasts a collection of world-class attractions including SeaWorld, the San Diego Zoo and the USS Midway Museum to name a few. Balboa Park, the nation's largest urban cultural park, is home to 15 museums and The Old



Globe Theatre. North of the city is Legoland California and to the northeast lies the zoo's amazing Wild Animal Park. The East County area offers casino gaming and gorgeous desert and mountain landscapes. And out in the bay, across an easily accessed majestic bridge, is Coronado Island with spectacular lodging options including the historic Hotel Del Coronado, one of the nation's last remaining Victorian seaside resorts. Both bay and ocean beaches, 15 miles of recreation paths, an island golf course and popular restaurants and shops round out Coronado's appeal.

That barely scratches the surface of what this area offers. The truth is that few "stay-and-play" destinations offer as much on and off the golf course as does this breezy California city blessed with nearly perpetual sun.

SWEET SPOT FOR GOLF

With more than 90 golf courses in every conceivable setting from mountain to desert to ocean, it's no wonder that Golf Digest named San Diego one of the Top 50 golf destinations in the world. Better yet, the weather is so idyllic that Weatherbill.com awarded San Diego top billing for having more perfect days for golf than anywhere else in the nation.

LOCAL PROS

San Diego has been nurturing championship golfers for decades. In the 1960s, PGA pros Billy Casper, Gene Littler and Phil Rodgers were the 1-2-3 punch from San Diego. Casper, a two-time PGA player of the year and two-time U.S. Open winner, was inducted into the World Golf Hall Of Fame in 1978. Littler, a San Diego State University alum, won the U.S. Open in 1961 and was inducted into the Hall Of Fame in 1990. Rodgers, a winner of many tour tournaments and a Top 100 Teacher, still teaches today at The Grand Del Mar. Another U.S. Open winner, Scott Simpson lives here when he is not on the Champions Tour. Phil Mickelson, four-





time major winner, lives in Rancho Santa Fe and is often seen playing area courses to keep his game sharp. San Diego is also the birthplace of Mickey Wright, winner of 82 LPGA events.

GOLF EVENTS

City owned Torrey Pines Golf Course has hosted many PGA tournaments. Among the most memorable was the 2008 U.S. Open won by Tiger Woods in historic fashion - 91 holes including the dramatic playoff with Rocco Mediate. The Callaway Junior World Championship, held at various courses throughout San Diego County since 1968, brings rising young stars from around the world to compete before agents, pros and fans. In March of this year the LPGA and its top women golfers competed in the J Golf LPGA Classic at La Costa Resort and Spa in nearby Carlsbad, Calif.



LEGACY OF RENOWNED GOLF-COURSE DESIGN

Several famed golf-course designers have made their mark on San Diego's landscape. Rees Jones brought his skills to the scenic South Course of Torrey Pines Golf Course for the 2008 U.S. Open. Arnold Palmer's masterpiece at Park Hyatt Aviara Resort has been cited by golf publications as one of the best resort courses in America. Gary Roger Baird preserved the surrounding natural environment while designing Barona Creek Golf Club. Gary Player created a course within a working ranch at Steele Canyon, and Pete Dye's name is on the course at Carlton Oaks. Tom Fazio, architect of courses worldwide. has called his work at The Grand Del Mar among best. Fame and popularity his notwithstanding, San Diego golf courses typically have reasonable greens fees. Municipal courses in Coronado, Balboa Park, National City and Oceanside may offer the best prices, but all area courses set fees low enough to keep golfers coming back for more.

MADERAS GOLF CLUB

Founded in 1999 and now one of Southern California's premier destinations, the Maderas Golf Club is nestled amid the rolling hills of Rancho Bernardo/Poway, just minutes from downtown San Diego.



The Johnny Miller-Robert Graves layout winds through 100-year-old live oaks, sycamores, creeks, lakes, waterfalls and more than 40 acres of native wildflowers. The Tuscan style clubhouse is home to the award-winning Grille at Maderas where lunch can be a hamburger or a full-on gourmet meal. Learn more at *maderasgolf.com* or phone the club at 858.451.8100

GOLF IN THE MORNING, RACETRACK IN THE AFTERNOON

Racing season at Del Mar Racetrack runs from mid-July to early September and the long days give golfers plenty of

time to play a round and watch thoroughbred racing on the same day. Many courses are no more than 30 minutes from the track. Just up the road is The Grand Del Mar, where Fazio's masterpiece is open to the public. The luxury AAA Five Diamond resort opened in the fall of 2007 and is already among the world's most lauded hotels. La Costa Resort and Spa offers two 18-hole gems that have played host to many PGA events through the years, and Park Hyatt Aviara Resort has what may be the prettiest 18 holes in all of Southern California. Morgan Run Club & Resort, the closest course to Del Mar Racetrack, offers stay-and-play packages during race season.

Brawn, luxury, safety, performance – the impressive G55 may just be worth its hefty price tag

t began as a military wagon. It has become a symbol of strength. Worldwide, armies have ordered tens of thousands of the Mercedes-Benz G series in one form or another over the years. Today, families are taking this tamed tank to the battle of the Joneses and winning in style. The latest and most powerful G-series is the AMG G55. This super-charged V-8 carries all the power and speed that you'd expect from Mercedes and its uber custom line AMG. If you see one on the street, you know you're seeing something special. Not only is the G55 fast, it's impressive to look at if for no other reason than its sheer girth. This heavyweight is tall and beefy. At 184 inches long and 76

its sheer girth. This heavyweight is tall and beefy. At 184 inches long and 76 inches high, the G55 cuts a swath on the highway or the trail. The boxy shape is unmistakable. Calling an AMG boxy feels sacrilegious but the G55 wears its profile with pride.

"It is definitely a unique style," says Ben Hossini, sales professional at Murray Motors in Denver. "I think it's the best SUV you can buy."

Don't let the bulk fool you; this vehicle flies like a butterfly. The 5.5 L engine pounds out 500 horsepower. Through high-tech engineering and modern materials, the Germans have kept the





weight to just over 5,000 pounds, meaning the G55 can launch like a rocket off the line. It rifles 0 to 60 in 5.4 seconds.

Yet just because the G55 is fast doesn't mean you can underestimate its ability to travel off the pavement. The five-speed automatic transmission hasn't been replaced by the popular AMG sevenspeed because the five-speed delivers more torque - over 500 ft/lbs at peak RPM. The solid axle front suspension is the best configuration you can buy for off-road driving. Remember, this is a fighter. With three different driving modes, full-time "4Matic" four-wheel drive locking the three hubs and a traction control option, the G55 is equipped for nearly anything. The length of the four-door model sold in the U.S. may limit some of the places you can take this beast, but probably not as much as the six-figure price tag does on its own.

When you decide to purchase the G55 you are deciding you want the best. The Mercedes Electronic Stability Program rivals anything of its kind on the road. When the vehicle's computer senses shake, yaw or other factors affecting safety, it adjusts engine torque and braking to correct for the condition. Mercedes is spending millions on it safety features and the G55 is a flagship. Smart airbags and numerous features you'd expect from one of the top automakers in the world keep drivers coming back. You aren't likely to buy this vehicle if you'd be fine settling for a Land Rover or other such SUV that ably handles Colorado snow. Buyers who choose AMG choose it for its superb quality in an already superb line of vehicles. Mercedes knows this and keeps the AMG brand apparent in chrome stamping on the running boards and throughout the interior. The brilliant extras act as medals on the lapel of a brave warrior — demanding respect and, in some cases, inducing humility.

The Mercedes brand name doesn't disappoint in the G55 either. Though it may look like the muscle of the AMG family business, it's no less distinct and defined inside. Luxury leather seating reminds drivers that they are driving a luxury vehicle. Rich wood trim lines the gear shift, doors and steering wheel. Of course, the rear-folding seats create storage space to get even the largest of families' pets, groceries and golf clubs home all in one trip.

The state-of-the-art telematics console controls everything from the environmental details to the entertainment. With 4 GB's of space for music and additional universal adapters for nearly any device that carries music, you are prepared for a lifetime of tunes and movies. The HD navigation system gives a 6.5-inch screen and aerial-view capability.

The G55 retails for \$123,000 and is hard to find. You can almost guarantee

you'll be the only one rolling this parade vehicle through the neighborhood which makes it a contender in the contest for awe-factor as well as performance. Owners will fight the urge to mount an insurrection on the ski slope because they know they have the power to do it with the G55.

From the Pope to Hillary Duff, owners of the G-series are in good company.
